John (Mick) Albin Lee OAM JP, Life Member Club 17

My Mentor

I first met Mick when I was a member of the local swimming club and he was a City of Perth councillor. He was a charismatic person who got on with everybody and had a great sense of humour. At the time I was president of the swimming club and he heard me make a speech while presenting some trophies. He invited me to come along to Rostrum as he thought it would help me. It was his subtle way of saying 'you need some help, mate'. From that time on Mick became my mentor.

At Mick's suggestion I joined Club 17 – 35 years ago. Because of Mick's guidance I had a change of career and my life became very exciting and successful. Does this sound like I'm pushing my ego? No, it was all because of Mick's influence. He had a natural effect on people that made them believe in themselves.

Mick joined Club 17 two weeks after it started. He was beginning his second

career as a city councillor and thought that Rostrum might help him in his non-public speaking experience. It certainly did. He became an influential figure in local government. In 1972, his ninth year as a councillor in the City of Perth, he became Deputy Lord Mayor. Proof of his effectiveness and popularity came when he became the first Mayor of the newly formed Town of Victoria Park in 1995. He went on to win three successive terms as Mayor until he retired in 2007.

During WWII Mick served on submarines in the Royal Navy. When his vessel called into Fremantle he met a Carlisle girl. After he was demobbed in Sydney he married Thelma and they lived in Carlisle. He was the patron, president and member of numerous associations. He was rewarded in 1986 with the Order of Australia Medal and was made a Member of the Order of Australia in 2008, for service



to local government in Victoria Park and for community leadership.

Mick passed away on 4th May. There was a full house at his funeral, a tribute to a man who had the wellbeing of the community at heart. That cheeky jovial face with impish eyes will ever be remembered.
